



OGDENSBURG WELCOMES YOU




Ogdensburg is situated on the beautiful St. Lawrence River and offers many exciting recreational choices including fishing, hunting, boating, swimming, golfing and skiing. Ogdensburg has a four acre Greenbelt, a 45-slip municipal marina, twin boat launch, picnic areas, lighted tennis court, exercise trails, and ice arena. Ogdensburg is the only community designated as a city in St. Lawrence County.

Ogdensburg is a must-see for American history enthusiasts. More than 250 years ago it was the site of the last battle of the French and Indian War between France and Britain and also played a role in the Revolutionary War of 1812.

Much of the action centered on the riverfront site of Fort de la Présentation, established in 1749 by French born Abbé François Piquet. The Fort La Présentation Association hosts special events throughout the year, including its annual Founder's Day Weekend in July that draws hundreds of reenactors from across the northeast and Canada to Ogdensburg, to conduct historically accurate land and water "battles."





Boaters can use one of the city's transient slips and take advantage of the center's lounge, kitchen and hot showers.


Information panels inside the center tell of Ogdensburg's colorful history from the rum-running days of Prohibition, and also of its traditional role as a destination for fantastic sport fishing for muskie, carp, bass and more sought-after species. Ogdensburg hosts local and regional fishing tournaments throughout the year.

West on Route 37, check out the small communities on or near the St. Lawrence River. In Morristown check out the Chapman Windmill which was used as a look-out point during the War of 1812.











LOCAL LEGENDS



LIGHTHOUSE: The Ogdensburg Lighthouse at Van Rensselaer Point, St. Lawrence River, was completed by the federal government in 1835 and was completely redone and made taller in 1869-70. The lighthouse was an aid to naviga-

tors entering the Ogdensburg Harbor at night. It was a difficult passage through cross currents along narrow winding channels between shoals. The Government stopped using the lighthouse in 1942 and it was decommissioned some time later. In 1964 Thomas & Laurel Roethel purchased it as a summer home. In 2011 Laurel Roethel relit the light in the tower for

the first time in decades. The Roethels hope to open the Lighthouse to the public after the renovations to the interior of the tower are completed.

STAINED GLASS: Ogdensburg has a wealth of art in stained glass and windows in some of the local churches. Harry J. Horwood of Ogdensburg, internationally known stained glass artisan, a descendant of generations of stained glass artisans, executed windows located in the following churches in Ogdensburg. First Baptist, Congregational, Norte Dame, and First Presbyterian. His windows in St. Mary's Cathedral were destroyed in the fire of 1947. Many private homes in the city have some decorative Horwood stained glass windows. Today, Ogdensburg's David Martin has photographed every single stained glass window in St. Lawrence County and has cataloged the history.

Scandalous

FREDERIC REMINGTON ART MUSEUM & KID'S PLACE

Since its inception in 1923, the museum has presented Frederic Remington's art and studio treasures in the context of the historic Parish Mansion. Built in 1809

and renovated around 1900, the mansion itself satisfies the cravings of history buffs. Its furnishings evoke the comfortable lifestyle of Frederic Remington and his cohorts. Remington's widow Eva, lived in this house from 1915 to 1918. In her will, she left her collection of Remington's art, archives, and much of their household furniture to form the museum's collection.

Expansion has provided additional gallery space that provides a fitting and secure context for Remington's paintings, drawings and bronzes.

The museum's newly developed education center provides opportunities for families to explore aspects of Remington's world and artistic process. Directed primarily to kids between four and fourteen. This hands-on center encourages fun with creative play, sketching and modeling with artist's materials. "Kid" was Frederic Remington's nickname for his wife, Eva.





The St. Lawrence River is a scuba divers treasure-filled playground. While diving around Ogdensburg keep you eyes open for: automobiles that went through the ice while smuggling whiskey to the US during prohibition, ferry tokens, cannonballs, anchors and shipwrecks. Old Whiskey bottles full of moonshine might even be found! If you find one, don't remove the cork or drink the fluid, as it should be tested for actual substance. If you are lucky, one of the lost-in-time treasures that you uncover might be an actual bottle of whiskey. If authentic old mellow whiskey, you will have yourself a collectible item worth over a grand. Many bottles are found in "bottle alley" just off the Ogdensburg Port.



OUR AMISH NEIGHBORS

New York's Amish population is the fastest growing in the US and St. Lawrence County is home to the second largest Amish community in the state. The Old Order Amish descendants of the radical Anabaptist Reformation, first came to the North Country in 1974 in search of available farmland. St. Lawrence County is now home to 11 different Amish communities, each with their own churches, schools and customs. Understanding some of these customs, such as reliance by many Amish on slow-moving horse-and-buggies, can help keep our roadways and our communities safer.

ST. LAWRENCE GOLF **COURSE & WINTER** RECREATION CENTER

LOCATION: 4955 State Highway 37, Ogdensburg, NY. GOLFING: The nine-hole St. Lawrence Golf Course is open April 26 through Columbus Day Weekend. Tee times may be reserved two days prior to play by calling 315-393-2286. WINTER MONTHS: Cross-country skiing is permitted on the parks trails, and when weather permits sledding is allowed on the sledding hill. The warming building is open on weekends.

The Ogdensburg Golf Club was started in 1919 by a group of five Ogdensburg area golfers as a private golf and social club. Since then it has been sold to New York State which has developed it into a park facility which includes a concession, 9 hole golf course, putting green, club house, pro shop, cart rentals, driving range and crosscountry ski trails.

SINGER CASTLE ON DARK ISLAND

LOCATION: 9 Miles from Alexandria Bay, NY. Boat transportation to the island can be booked by calling Uncle Sam Boat Tours at 1-800-253-9229 and Rockport Boat Line at 1-800-563-8687. Shuttles are also available from Schermerhorn Harbor at 1-315-324-5966. Private boat dockage is available on our 600 foot dock. ADMIS-SION: adults: \$14; children 4-12: \$7; military discount. Prearranged private tours can be arranged from additional cost.

Proudly perched atop a seven acre island in the middle of the majestic St. Lawrence River sits the well-preserved five story granite "hunting lodge" constructed for the wealthy outdoors man and Singer Manufacturing Company's fifth president, Frederick Bourne. Designed by architect Ernest Flagg, this 28 room castle is furnished much as it was for the Bournes from 1905 to 1919 and one of their daughters who used it until 1961. Bourne's island estate included two boat houses, two ice houses, a pergola, flower garden and a green that was once a grass tennis court and a squash court. A guided tour of this grand home and its grounds allows visitors to view and imagine the privileged lives of those who frequented the Thousand Islands area in the midst of the grandeur of the Golden Age.

FISHING THE ST. LAWRENCE

Fishing licenses and fishing regulation guides are available at City Hall, 330 Ford Street (315) 393-3540 or at WalMart on outer Ford Street (315) 394-8990. www. ogdensburg.org

ICE FISHING: One of Ogdensburg's most popular winter sports is ice fishing on Wheathouse Bay near the Port of Ogdensburg. Access is gained via Wall Street and this bay is recognized as one of the best ice fishing locations along the St. Lawrence River. Northern Pike, yellow perch and walleye are the most popular species. Regulations allow five tip ups and two hand lines.


THE OSWEGATCHIE RIVER: Check with the New York State DEC regarding regulations for fishing this tributary of the St. Lawrence River. www.nys.dec.ny.gov.

The Oswegatchie flows through Ogdensburg and into the St. Lawrence River. This river holds populations of small mouth bass, walleyes, northern pike, muskies, cat-fish and pan fish. The Oswegatchie offers anglers the opportunity to fish from shore, to wade for fish or to use a canoe or motorboat.

ST LAWRENCE RIVER FISHING: For everything you want to know about fishing in the St. Lawrence River and the lakes, streams and rivers feeding it, go to FISH-CAP.com

The St. Lawrence is an angler's paradise. In fact, some of the best muskie fishing in the world is found here in the St. Lawrence. Opportunities exist for anglers of all ages, skill levels and interests. The river's personality varies from narrow, stretches of current, to wide lake-like expanses. Prime fish holding structures abound along the entire river. Muskellunge, small and large mouth bass, northern pike, walleye, and carp abound in the river. The St. Lawrence also has crappies, pumpkinseeds, rock bass, yellow perch, bullheads, catfish, coho and chinook salmon, lake, brown and rainbow trout, suckers, drum and more. Sturgeon is being reintroduced in our waterways, but possession is illegal.



DOBISKY VISITOR'S CENTER

Located at 100 Riverside Ave., the Dobisky Visitors' Center is designed to be a showcase of the City of Ogdensburg. The stone and glass building has many amenities including a boaters lounge with showers and laundry facilities, meeting rooms that can hold 100 people overlooking the majestic St. Lawrence River, a large roofed outdoor deck, a kitchen area, a food and beverage concession and handicapped accessible restrooms.

NATURE TRAIL

Visitors enjoy the natural beauty, breathtaking scenery and a rich cultural history as they walk along the Maple City Trail. This trail starts in Greenbelt park on the St. Lawrence and travels along the Oswegatchie Rivers for a distance of about 2.2 miles. The trail is open to the public and features points of interest, benches and lookouts along the way. There is also a recreation trail near the foot of the Ogdensburg-Prescott International Bridge.


















The creation of the 65-mile St. Lawrence County Wine Trail, which stretches from Hammond to Wintrhop, means tourists will have a chance to visit three of the county's wineries including the High Peaks Winery, Bella-Brooke Vineyard and River Myst Winery. "Word is starting to spread that the north country is producing some of the best wines in the state and world," Assemblywoman Addie J. Russell said.

Travelers are required to present a WHTI-compliant (Western Hemisphere Travel Initiative) document for entry into the United States by land or sea from Canada, Mexico, the Caribbean or Bermuda.
